## Mission of the Whatcom Conservation District

- *To serve present and future generations of Whatcom County through a natural resource conservation program of leadership, partnership, and technical, educational & financial assistance to foster a healthy, sustainable relationship between people and the environment.*

---

## Natural Resource Priorities and Goals:

- **Improving Water Resources**
  - Surface waters of the Drayton Harbor and Nooksack watersheds will, respectively, meet water quality or TMDL bacterial standards
  - Levels of nitrates in the rural public water supplies of the North County will be reduced to less than 10 mg/liter
  - The quantity of water available for both in and out-of-stream uses for the Bertrand and Fishtrap sub-basins will markedly increase.
  - Flooding from stormwater and poor drainage will be reduced in Ag lands.
- **Sustaining Agriculture**
  - The AG zoning designation will expand to 100,000 acres of farmland.
  - The conflicts between Agricultural and Residential uses will be reduced.
  - City, County and State governments will not adopt policies that result in a net loss in farmland or unduly and unreasonably hamper the ability of local agricultural operations to sustain themselves.
- **Forest Enhancement**
  - The productivity of small woodlots will increase.
  - Homeowners and communities will become safer from the threat of wildfires.
- **Habitat Enhancement**
  - Enhance or protect riparian areas along 10 miles of degraded watercourses.
  - Four Drainage Improvement Districts will develop fish-friendly, management plans including maintenance of ditches, appropriate riparian area implementation, and water storage.

- *Partner with Whatcom County Planning & Development Services to deliver a program of technical and cost share assistance to non-commercial livestock operations that result in the implementation of best management practices that protect sensitive areas and improve water quality.*
